Text der Ankündigung:	<p>Course objective: Active participation in this international project work is ideal for developing students' fluency in English. Prerequisites: Ability to work in small team, e.g. website team, project development team, digital storytelling team, film production team, language games team, etc. Recommended reading: E. Wenger's Communities of Practice (in Deutsch or English), John Dewey's Democracy and Education (Deutsch or English), T. Vogt's 'Multimedia Wittgenstein' (Deutsch or English). J. Ife's Community Development Teaching methods: Lectures consist of 45 minutes of open discussion about current 5D-project developments followed by 45 minutes of traditional lecturing & discussion followed by 30 minutes of "community building workshops" where students break up into small teams and talk, plan, and produce multimedia Assessment methods: Fieldnotes (in English or Deutsch) from fieldwork in 5D-Karls gymnasium plus a 7-10 page Erfahrungsbericht (in English or Deutsch) or an 10-15 page Hausarbeit (in English or Deutsch). Language of instruction: English Links: www.uclinks.org & www.5DDAugsburg.de Course content: The "Fifth Dimension Project", or "5D" for short, is an international, interdisciplinary research project which uses a variety of educational technologies to create and sustain win/win learning partnerships between universities and community institutions such as community centers, youth clubs, and schools (see www.uclinks.org & www.5DDAugsburg.de). In this Seminar, we use 5D projects as models for community building activities in Bayern and throughout Germany with a special emphasis on connecting to Prof. Elsen's Community Building program here at the HM (see www.macd.hm.edu).
